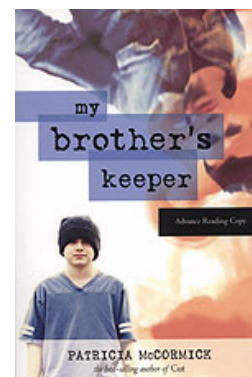
## Middle School Reading Series
